



Statement by
The Republic of Slovenia

at the

**Eleventh Conference of States Parties to the Arms Trade Treaty,
Treaty Implementation**

Geneva, 25-29 August 2025

Thank you, Mr President,

Slovenia aligns itself with the statement delivered by the European Union and would like to add the following in its national capacity.

We welcome the discussions on the implementation, particularly with regard to Article 7, and emphasize the need to continue strengthening inter-agency cooperation at the national level. In our experience, such cooperation is essential to ensure coherence across ministries and agencies responsible for licensing, border control, and enforcement. Slovenia remains committed to enhancing coordination among relevant stakeholders to maintain a transparent and accountable arms transfer system.

Slovenia underscores the importance of robust and effective national implementation of the Treaty, as it is the cornerstone of achieving the ATT's objectives of contributing to international and regional peace, security, and reducing human suffering. For this reason, Slovenia does not issue export and transit licences for military goods and technologies listed on Common Military List of the European Union to conflict areas where international law, international humanitarian law or international human rights law is blatantly violated.

We therefore note the relevance of aligning ATT implementation with international human rights law and international humanitarian law. In this regard, we support the exploration of measures that reinforce due diligence responsibilities, including those of industry actors involved in the arms trade. Private sector engagement and awareness are critical components of preventing diversion and ensuring treaty compliance.

In closing, Slovenia reiterates its strong support for the Arms Trade Treaty and remains committed to working collaboratively to enhance the effectiveness of its implementation.
